The letter concerns: Malcom's mission in Persia, including the relationship with the mission of Sir Harford Jones, British Envoy Extraordinary, also present in the country; communication with Meerza Shuffee [Mīrzā Muḥammad Shafī' Māzandarānī], Grand Vizier (Sadr-e 'Azam), and the Ameen ud-Dowlah [Ḥājī Muḥammad Ḥusayn Khān Amīn al-Dawlah]; the expected arrival in Persia of James Morier; and the murder of Captain Grant and Cornet Fotheringham on the road from Bagdad [Baghdad] to Persia.

of India.

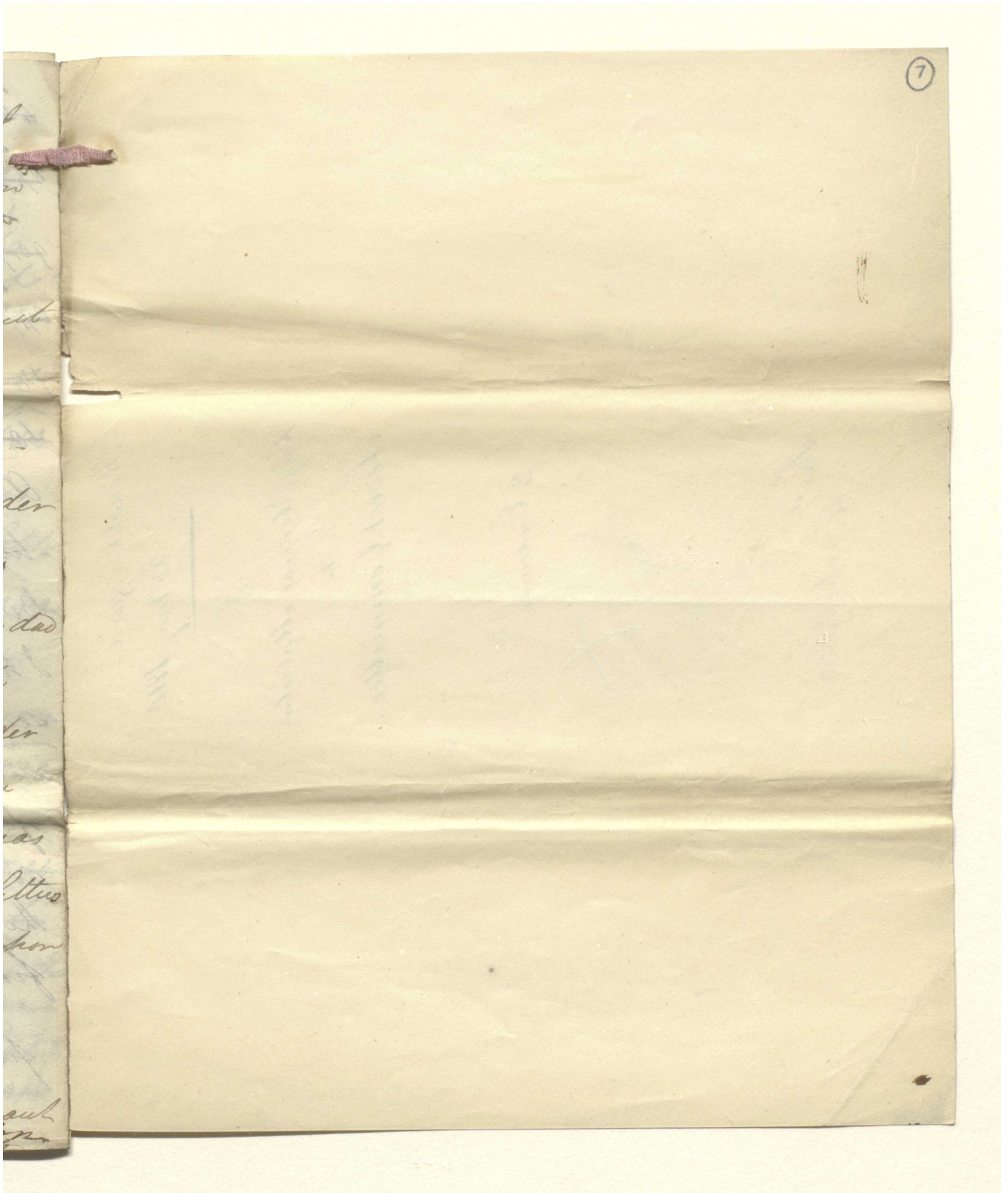
[Your Honble Committee will have been in-
formed by the Resident of Bagdad of the murder
of Captain Grant and Mr. Litheringham two
Officers of my suite on their route from Bagdad
to Isfahan where I had directed them to join
me, The treachery and cruelty by which this murder

the condign punishment of those by whom it was
